UNIFORM POLICY

Aims and objectives

Our policy for school uniform is based on the notion that school uniform:

- Promotes a sense of pride in the school
- Engenders a sense of community and belonging towards the school
- Is practical and smart
- Makes children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance
- Is regarded as suitable wear for school and is considered by parents as good value for money
- Is designed with health and safety in mind

School Uniform

It is our school policy that all children wear school uniform when attending school whether for on or off site activities. We expect parents to provide their child with uniform and appropriate PE kit. Scampton Church of England Primary School uniform consists of:

Girls	Boys
• White blouse or polo shirt • Dark grey pinafore dress or Skirt (pleated or flared – not split) or dark grey trousers (not cords or jeans) • White socks or grey tights (no patterned tights or socks) <u>Alternative Summer Uniform</u> • Lightweight red and white gingham dress	• White shirt or polo shirt • Dark grey trousers or shorts (not cords or jeans).



PE Kit

School PE shirt with logo (preferred) or white T shirt
 Plain black shorts or games skirt
 Plimsols for indoor PE sessions
 Trainers and plain black tracksuit for outside PE lessons

School Sweatshirt or cardigan (with logo)
 Reading book bag
 Water bottle with a sports cap

Footwear

The school expects children to wear black shoes fastened with velcro, laces or buckles. Trainers are not acceptable footwear to be worn throughout the day although children may wish to bring a pair of trainers to school to wear at breaktimes. Sling back and slip on shoes are not acceptable footwear. Wearing of leather type sandals with a sound ankle and toe straps (worn with socks) may be worn during the summer term although parents and children are alerted to the potential hazard of injury in the case of open toed sandals.

Coats

It is recommended that children wear a coat appropriate for the current season.

Jewellery

No Jewellery should be worn at school. Studs are the only acceptable form of piercing. *Children who have studs must be able to remove them by themselves for PE lessons.*

Hair

Extreme hairstyles (ie dyed a non-natural hair colour or shaved into a pattern) are not allowed.

PE Days

On days when pupils have a timetabled PE lesson, they may come to school already dressed in PE kit.

The Role of Parents

We ask all parents who send their children to our school to support the school uniform policy. It is the responsibility of parents to ensure that their child has the correct uniform and that it is clean, in good repair and properly labelled. Due to the limited amount of cloakroom space in the school, parents are asked to support school by discouraging large bags being brought in to school

The role of school staff:

We will:

- Provide a copy of this policy to all parents and making it available on the school website or in the school's brochure.
- Discuss with children the importance and requirements of our school uniform.
- Accept reasonable explanations should school uniform not be worn (this may be at the discretion of the Headteacher).
- Ask children to remove stud earrings for PE lessons.
- Send home a copy of our uniform policy to individuals if there are persistent breaches of the policy.

The Role of Governors

It is the governors' responsibility to ensure that the school uniform meets all the regulations concerning equal opportunities. The governors will consider, with the Headteacher, any requests from parents for individual children to have special dispensation, either for religious or medical reasons, with regard to school uniform. The Governors consider the following items to be acceptable:

- Head scarves, Kippars or turbans.
- Dhoti (trousers worn by Hindus), items related to the Sikh Panj Kakke (only Kachera, kkangha Kara) or any other clothing but this should be in keeping with the uniform colours of grey, white and red.
